A Letter From The Pastor

During our trip to Italy, we flew in and out of the city of Milan.

Though we didn't spend any time there initially, when we returned for our outbound flight, we had about a day. I looked up activities to do and came across the Milan Cathedral (Duomo di Milano). Tickets for that day were sold out, guided tours for that day were also sold out.

Other than going into the center of the city to just walk around the outside of this massive cathedral, there was no going inside.

Apparently, the church capacity is 40,000 so even a walk around the outside would have been impressive. As I read about the history of the cathedral, I was surprised to see that it was only completed in 1965; this is a solid 100 years after the building of Mt. Olivet's sanctuary. Of course

that only tells half of the story. When was the construction of the cathedral begun? It was in 1386 by Archbishop Antonio da Saluzzo. Yes, you read that correctly, the Milan Cathedral took almost 600 years to complete! How many iterations of "Pardon the Dust" signs did they require?! Today, the cathedral is visited by thousands per year connecting tourists and faithful alike with God every day.

Each generation within the life of Milan Cathedral had to take ownership of continuing the building process. I'm sure there were plenty that wished it to "just be done." Or asked themselves "when will this end?" The answer, of course, is never. Though the construction of Milan Cathedral is complete, renovations, cleaning, upkeep, etc., fall to the current generation of faithful. Parts of Mt. Olivet are just 160 years old, with others much younger, but the work remains the same. Upkeep, maintenance, cleaning and renovations remain what each generation must do to keep God's building in proper working order. We are the current generation. The work belongs to us to keep this place a beautiful center for connecting the faithful with God and discipling a new generation of believers. Your efforts are needed. Whether it's deep cleaning a room, washing windows, volunteering to paint or helping with other maintenance/ property issues, you are wanted. Please consider how you can help keep our small cathedral shining with God's beauty and acting as a way to glorify God with our dutiful service and worship.
